Charges:

1. On or about January 3, 2024, and at the YEG Chiro + Neuro (Edmonton) Chiropractic Neurology and Sports Clinic (the “Clinic”) during a spinal exam of patient MA (“Patient M.A.”) and/or an assessment of Patient M.A. spinal curvature:

- a) You directed Patient M.A. to stand up and bend over fully from the waist; and/or
- b) You directed Patient M.A. to bend over further; and/or
- c) You lifted up Patient M.A.’s shirt and/or undid her bra;

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the Act and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the Act including breaching the CCOA’s Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct.

2. On or about January 3, 2024, and at the Clinic and as part of the events described in charge 1, you re-fastened the clasp or clasps on Patient M.A.’s bra without any or any appropriate patient consent.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purpose of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) including breaching the CCOA’s Standard of Practice 3.1 - Informed Consent; and/or

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purpose of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the Act and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the Act including breaching the CCOA’s Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct.

3. On or about January 3, 2024, and at the Clinic, and while ostensibly checking the measurements of Patient M.A.’s legs:

- a) You advised Patient M.A. that she needed to undo her pants in order for you to properly measure her leg length; and/or
- b) You moved Patient M.A.’s pants and underwear down past her belly button;

Without any and/or without any appropriate clinical reason and/or which conduct constitutes Sexual Misconduct.



All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) including breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 5.2 – Clinical Relevance of Treatment Recommendations, Standard of Practice 4.0 – Provision of Professional Services, Standard of Practice 4.1 – Scope of Practice for Chiropractors and/or CCOA Code of Ethics Section A4 – Competence, Consultation and Referral; and/or

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purpose of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the Act and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the Act including breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct.

1. On or about January 3, 2024, and at the Clinic and while Patient M.A. was lying on a treatment table, you palpated Patient M.A.'s femoral artery on her right leg and/or her left leg by:
 - a) Placing your hand down Patient M.A.'s pants; and/or
 - b) Placing your hand onto her groin area; and/or
 - c) Placing your hand onto her left mid-thigh and/or her right mid-thigh;

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purpose of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the Act and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the Act including breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct.

2. On or about January 3, 2024, and at the Clinic and while Patient M.A. was lying on a treatment table, you palpated Patient M.A.'s femoral artery on her right leg and/or her left leg by:
 - a) Placing your hand down Patient M.A.'s pants; and/or
 - b) Placing your hand onto her groin area; and/or
 - c) Placing your hand onto her left mid-thigh and/or her right mid-thigh;

Without having any or any reasonable clinical purpose and/or inconsistent with any or any reasonable clinical practice and/or without any or any appropriate patient consent.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the Act including breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 5.2 – Clinical Relevance of Treatment Recommendations, Standard of Practice 4.0 – Provision of Professional Services, Standard of Practice 4.1 – Scope of Practice for Chiropractors and/or CCOA Code of Ethics Section A4 – Competence, Consultation and Referral; and/or breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 3.1 - Informed Consent.

3. The patient records for Patient M.A. are incomplete and/or illegible, all of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the Act including breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 5.1 - Record Keeping Requirements.



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Although open to the public, the Hearing Tribunal can close a portion or all of the Hearing at any time. When this occurs, all those who are registered to attend will be asked to leave.
