Charges:

1. On or about April 11, 2024, and at the YEG Chiro + Neuro (Edmonton Chiropractic Neurology and Sports Clinic) (the “Clinic”), you made inappropriate comments to patient O.B. (“Patient O.B.”) including:
 - a) Describing an incident where all the other players on your team were put in hotel rooms with another student, but you were placed in a hotel room alone with your coach with only one bed;
 - b) You were sexually abused by the said coach;
 - c) You would be a witness in a trial concerning the said coach;
 - d) There is both painful and pleasurable anal sex; and/or
 - e) Telling Patient O.B. about a movie you had watched where you had seen a young boy being anally raped;

or words to that effect.

Which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i) and/or (xii) of the Act including breaching the CCOA’s Standard of Practice 6.1 – Professional Boundaries with Patients and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the Act including breaching the CCOA’s Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct.

2. On or about April 11, 2024, and at the Clinic and while ostensibly adjusting Patient’s O.B.’s hip, you put your hand at the top of Patient O.B.’s inner thigh resting between her vagina and the top of her thigh with your thumb under her buttocks.

Which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purpose of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the Act and/or sexual abuse as defined in section 1(nn.1) of the Act including breaching the CCOA’s Standard of Practice 6.6 – Sexual Abuse and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the Act including breaching the CCOA’s Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct.

3. On or about April 11, 2024 and at the Clinic and while ostensibly adjusting Patient O.B.’s hip, you proceeded with treatment without any or any appropriate patient consent.



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Which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purpose of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) including breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 3.1 - Informed Consent.

4. On or about dates to be determined and at the Clinic, you made inappropriate comments to Patient O.B. including comments about your ex-wife and your custody battle concerning your daughter or words to that effect.

Which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i) and/or (xii) of the Act including breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 6.1 – Professional Boundaries with Patients.

5. On or about April 11, 2024 and at the Clinic you disclosed the name and University of Alberta position of a patient of the Clinic to Patient O.B. which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purpose of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the Act including breaching the CCOA's Code of Ethics - Article A7: Confidentiality and Release of Patient Information.
6. On or about February 3, 2025, and up to and including on or about February 12, 2025, and on any other dates that are pertinent, you failed to comply with the request of or co-operate with an investigator when you failed and/or refused to participate in a second investigation interview, which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purpose of section 1(1)(pp)(vii)(B) of the Act including breaching the CCOA's Code of Ethics - Article C2: Co-operation with the CCOA.

Although open to the public, the Hearing Tribunal can close a portion or all of the Hearing at any time. When this occurs, all those who are registered to attend will be asked to leave.
