Charges:

1. On or about June 30, 2022, and at the YEG Chiro+Neuro (Edmonton) Chiropractic Neurology and Sports Clinic (the “Clinic”), you made inappropriate comments to patient KO (“Patient KO”) including:

- a) whether Patient KO was single;
- b) whether Patient KO was happy;
- c) whether Patient KO was happy where she worked;
- d) commenting that Patient KO was slim;
- e) asking how Patient KO stayed slim; and/or
- f) commenting about Patient KO’s weight.

or words to that effect.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i),(ii) and/or (xi) of the *Health Professions Act* and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA’s Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct.

2. On or about June 30, 2022, and at the Clinic, during your initial assessment of Patient KO you touched her arms, chest, stomach and/or legs without any or any appropriate clinical purpose.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the *Health Professions Act* and/or breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 5.2 – Clinical Relevance of Treatment Recommendations and/or Standard of Practice 4.0 – Provision of Professional Services and/or CCOA Code of Ethics section A4 – Competence, Consultation and Referral and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA’s Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct and/or sexual abuse as defined in section 1(nn.1) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 6.6 – Sexual Abuse.

3. On or about June 30, 2022, and at the Clinic, when Patient KO was strapped to a traction table you touched her arms, chest, stomach and/or legs without any or any appropriate clinical purpose.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the *Health Professions Act* and/or breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 5.2 – Clinical Relevance of Treatment Recommendations and/or Standard of Practice 4.0 – Provision of Professional Services and/or CCOA Code of Ethics section A4 – Competence, Consultation and Referral and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA’s



Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct and/or sexual abuse as defined in section 1(nn.1) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 6.6 – Sexual Abuse.

4. On or about June 30, 2022, and at the Clinic, you placed Patient KO on a traction table without any or any appropriate patient consent.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 3.1 – Informed Consent.

5. On or about June 30, 2022, and at the Clinic, while standing behind Patient KO you placed your arms across Patient KO's body while ostensibly performing a rib adjustment without any or any appropriate patient consent and/or without any or any appropriate clinical purpose.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i)(ii) and/or (xii) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 3.1 – Informed Consent and/or breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 5.2 – Clinical Relevance of Treatment Recommendations, Standard of Practice 4.0 – Provision of Professional Services and/or Standard of Practice 4.1 – Scope of Practice for Chiropractors and/or CCOA Code of Ethics section A4 – Competence, Consultation and Referral.

6. On or about June 30, 2022, and at the Clinic, while Patient KO was lying on a treatment bed you rubbed Patient KO's stomach without any or any appropriate clinical purpose.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching CCOA Standard of Practice 5.2 – Clinical Relevance of Treatment Recommendations, Standard of Practice 4.0 – Provision of Professional Services, and/or CCOA Code of Ethics section A4 – Competence, Consultation and Referral and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct and/or sexual abuse as defined in section 1(nn.1) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 6.6 – Sexual Abuse.

7. On or about June 30, 2022, and at the Clinic, while allegedly adjusting Patient KO's pubic bone, you touched Patient KO's pubic bone without any or any appropriate patient consent.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1.1(pp)(i),(ii) and/or (xii) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 3.1 – Informed Consent and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct and/or sexual abuse as defined in section 1(nn.1) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 6.6 – Sexual Abuse.

8. On or about June 30, 2022, and at the Clinic, when ostensibly treating Patient KO due to one of her legs being longer than the other you;



- a) touched Patient KO's pubic bone; and/or
- b) touched Patient KO's vagina

without any or any appropriate patient consent and without any or any appropriate clinical purpose.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1.1(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching CCOA Standard of Practice 3.1 – Informed Consent, Standard of Practice 5.2 – Clinical Relevance of Treatment Recommendations, Standard of Practice 4.0 – Provision of Professional Services, and/or CCOA Code of Ethics section A4 – Competence, Consultation and Referral and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct and/or sexual abuse as defined in section 1(nn.1) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 6.6 – Sexual Abuse.

9. On or about June 30, 2022, and at the Clinic, while ostensibly treating Patient KO's tight hamstring you:
- a) massaged Patient KO's belly of her hamstring; and/or
 - b) massaged Patient KO's buttocks; and/or
 - c) touched Patient KO's vagina

without any and/or without any appropriate clinical purpose.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i),(ii) and/or (xii) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching CCOA Standard of Practice 5.2 – Clinical Relevance of Treatment Recommendations, Standard of Practice 4.0 – Provision of Professional Services and/or CCOA Code of Ethics section A4 – Competence, Consultation and Referral and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct and/or sexual abuse as defined in section 1(nn.1) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 6.6 – Sexual Abuse.

10. On or about June 30, 2022, and at the Clinic, while ostensibly treating Patient KO's sacroiliac (SI) joint pain, you placed one or both of your hands on Patient KO's buttocks without any and/or without any appropriate clinical purpose.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) of the *Health Professions Act* and/or breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 5.2 – Clinical Relevance of Treatment Recommendations and/or Standard of Practice 4.0 – Provision of Professional Services and/or CCOA Code of Ethics section A4 – Competence, Consultation and Referral and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA's Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct and/or sexual abuse as defined in section 1(nn.1) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching the CCOA Standard of Practice 6.6 – Sexual Abuse.
