Charges:

1. On or about October 11, 2023, and at the “Brodeur Wellness Clinic” (the “Clinic”) and while treating patient E.D. (“Patient E.D.”):
 - a) You placed one or both of your hands on her neck without any or any reasonable clinical purpose; and/or
 - b) You placed one or both of your hands on her neck without any or any appropriate patient consent; and/or
 - c) You stated “it looks like I am choking you, we should get a picture” or words to that effect.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) in the *Health Professions Act* including breaching CCOA Standard of Practice 3.1 – Informed Consent and/or CCOA Standard of Practice 6.1 – Professional Boundaries with Patients and/or CCOA Code of Ethics Article A5: Informed Choice of and Consent to Treatment.

2. On or about October 12, 2023, and at the Clinic and while treating Patient E.D.:
 - a) After causing a shoeprint/dust print to occur on Patient E.D.’s buttocks, you wiped the shoeprint/dust print off Patient E.D.’s buttocks without any or any appropriate consent; and/or
 - b) During or after wiping off the said shoeprint/dust on Patient E.D.’s buttocks, you stated “it looks like I am spanking you, but I can promise you I am not” or words to that effect; and/or
 - c) You asked Patient E.D. questions about her living situation without any or any appropriate clinical purpose.

All of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) and/or sexual misconduct as defined in section 1(nn.2) of the *Health Professions Act* including breaching CCOA Standard of Practice 3.1 – Informed Consent, and/or CCOA Standard of Practice 6.1 – Professional Boundaries with Patients and/or CCOA Standard of Practice 6.7 – Sexual Misconduct and/or CCOA Code of Ethics Article A5: Informed Choice of and Consent to Treatment.



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3. On or about October 11, 2023, and at the Clinic and while treating Patient E.D. you failed to communicate professionally with Patient E.D., all of which constitutes unprofessional conduct for the purposes of section 1(1)(pp)(i), (ii) and/or (xii) in the *Health Professions Act* including breaching CCOA Standard of Practice 1.2 Professional Communication.

Although open to the public, the Hearing Tribunal can close a portion or all of the Hearing at any time. When this occurs, all those who are registered to attend will be asked to leave.
